

Last year, The Food Sharing Project served 758,000 meals which is almost 4000 meals every school day to 16000 students, about half of the elementary and secondary students in schools in KFLA.

Who are they? The youth who told his teacher he would have had to drop out of school and get a job to add to family income if he and his siblings hadn't been fed at school. Or the student who put 8 milk cartons from The Food Sharing bin into his backpack because school was the only place his family could get dairy. They are the students who tell us they love the fresh fruit and vegetables at school. They tell us that the food at school makes them happy and they love trying new things like strawberries, cantaloupe, watermelon and grilled cheese sandwiches. It's startling when you hear that a grilled cheese sandwich might be something a child hasn't had before but along with fresh fruit and vegetables, cheese is expensive.

School has become the place where children can access the fresh food that is out of reach for their families. In Kingston, 1 in 10 families live with food insecurity and for many, rent is 50-70% of their income. When we can feed children and youth at school, it allows families to pay the rent.

We believe it takes a community to feed a child. We are very grateful to all of the community organizations, schools and individuals who so generously support our work to help students take advantage of everything school has to offer.

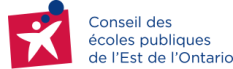
